Funding secured to run 'Bike Club' at school to teach non-riders. Involvement in Sports Competitions with local primaries – Dynamo Cricket, Tag-rugby tournament, Football tournaments – and involvement in the local secondary school's Sports Day for the Y5 cohort.
