

We will...

Share key texts linked to the topic.

Use topic based vocabulary.

Use stick puppets and story sacks to retell stories.

Create a book with family photos to discuss and handle.

We will...

Use inset puzzles

Count how many people live at home.

Use 2D and 3D shapes to build houses/homes.

Use images of front doors with numbers.

Tell stories from the past using key vocabulary: "first, then".
