Key information:

An emergency is when something unexpected happens and it needs action right away. For example, if there is a fire and we need someone to put it out, or if someone breaks a bone.

999 is the special number you need to call for the emergency services. These are the police, firefighters and an ambulance.

They have special vehicles, clothes and tools to help them do their jobs. The vehicles are usually brightly coloured and have flashing lights and sirens to let people know they are on their way.

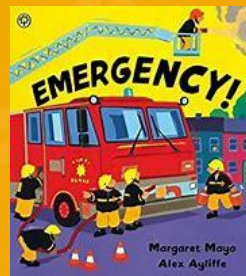
