<p>Reading: These are stories we will be reading aloud during story time this week. *What the Ladybird Heard *The Cave *Stickman *Room on the Broom *Caterpillar to Butterfly: Life Cycles - continued</p> <p>Remember to read a book together every day on Oxford Owl. https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/books/free-ebooks/</p> <p>Writing: This week the children will be creating a food diary.</p>  <p>Please continue to encourage and help your child to practice writing their names and number formation 0 to 9.</p>	<p>This week the children will play a listening game. They will listen to a number and then count the claps to match that number.</p>  <p>They children will also build a castle using 2d shapes (rectangle, square, circle and triangle). They will need to cut out the shapes and stick it together by listening to the instructions you give them. Make sure you include the use of positional language.</p> 	<p>Phonics: For phonics we are on Phase 1 of the Letters and Sounds. We are focusing on Aspect 2: General sound discrimination - instrumental sounds. This aspect aims to develop children's awareness of sounds made by various instruments and noise makers. Activities include comparing and matching sound makers, playing instruments alongside a story and making loud and quiet sounds.
