We currently take referrals from incidents in school and awareness from class teachers- if you feel your child would benefit from this due to something we are not aware of- do let your child's class teacher know.

OUR FOCUS THIS TERM

We are thrilled to welcome you all back for the final term of the year. We have many exciting things planned ahead such as jubilee learning, school trips, school productions, sports opportunities as well as end of year reports and the opportunity to meet your child's new teacher for next year. We will be focusing on transition this term, preparing children to be successful for next year. We do tend to leave these communications until the end of the term so as not to unsettle the children or cause any undue anxiety- we often find families can get nervous when the information is given too far in advance which can put a dampener on the end of a wonderful year. We hope to hold the transition sessions in the last two weeks of term and will work with children who may need extra support prior to this. We will be holding our end of year assessments over the next few weeks to give your child a chance to show all that they have learnt- don't worry, we do these in a very positive and gentle manner so your child may not even realise!
