PUNCTUALITY AT THE END OF THE SCHOOL DAY

Please can we remind everyone about the importance of being punctual at the end of the day. The school day finishes at 3.10pm in Reception, Year One and Year Two and at 3.15pm for KS2 (Years 3 to 6). This means we expect an adult to be ready to pick up each child promptly, unless your child is walking home. If you are unable to pick up your child on time, due to unforeseen circumstances, we would expect a phone call to the office.

Unfortunately, if a child is not collected on time, this has an impact on staffing and incurs costs for the Academy. If your child is picked up late on several occasions, then you may be charged for this via the MCAS App. Persistent late pick ups will incur a charge as follows: collected after 3.30pm there will be a charge of £5; collected after 3.45pm there will be a charge of £10.

We would appreciate your support with this. Late pick ups take valuable staff time away from providing an excellent education for your children. We know occasionally family things crop up- don't worry! We are just asking that you keep us informed and for families that are persistently late to please change their habits or incur a fine. All the time we spend with late children takes away from planning and preparing for great lessons in the classroom.

GATES- UPDATE FROM OUR REGIONAL DIRECTOR

Please take the time to read the letter sent from our Regional Director, Tom Verity, today. Due to the Risk Assessment put in place to keep children and families safe from road traffic accidents we are not able to allow families in through Corbett Close without prior permission from the headteacher.
