Let's talk about SPEED! The theme for Road Safety Week 2023 is Let's talk about SPEED. Five people die on UK roads every day. One in four fatal crashes involve someone driving too fast. By taking part in Road Safety Week 2023, you are joining a national conversation about



speed. We want to challenge why so many of us still think it's ok to speed and talk about solutions that we know can make roads safer for everyone. Whoever you are, however, you travel, we need to talk about speed.

This week we will be looking at Road Safety Week in school. This year's theme is all around being aware of speed and the damage speeding can do. Why not ask your child what they have learnt. Every year, each year group will take part in at least 3 fieldwork opportunities whereby children will ask a question and then go out and collect data in order to answer it in a geographical way. In T4 each year each class focuses on a sustainable development goal where we encourage and empower children to help be active changemakers in the world around them. Our geography curriculum aims to broaden our children's horizons to a world outside of their doorstep and help them take an active part in shaping it. It does this by focusing on the local and familiar in KS1 and building up to the similarities and difference across the wider world in KS2.
