All of the Design Technology lessons follow the design process giving our pupils opportunities to research, design, make, test, evaluate and develop. We link our learning in Design Technology to the thematic curriculum and try and solve real world problems along with gaining knowledge on how to design and make using a range of different materials and tools.



We also ensure our pupils gain technical knowledge of a range of technology including, cooking and nutrition, levers and linkages, mechanisms, CAD and electronics.

During Term 3 the year groups will be designing and making in the following areas:

Y1	Structures – building bridges
Y2	Mechanisms - Sliders, Levers, and Linkages
Y3	Textiles – weaving and dying
Y4	Axels and Wheels – Catapult Cars
Y5	Mechanisms – Automata, Cams and Hand- crafting Techniques
Y6	Electrics and Systems – Motorised Car
