Expressive Arts and Design

- Begin to develop complex stories using small world equipment like animal sets, dolls and dolls houses etc.
- Continues to explore moving in a range of ways, e.g. mirroring, creating own movement patterns
- Enjoys joining in with moving, dancing and ring games
- Sings familiar songs, e.g. pop songs,songs from TV programmes, rhymes, songs from home
- Taps out simple repeated rhythms
- Remember and sing entire songs

Personal, Social and Emotional Development 😥

- Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community.
- Show more confidence in new social situations.
- Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas.
- Practises skills or assertion negotiation and compromise and looks to a surportive adult for help in resolving conflict with peers.
- Understands that expectations vary depending on different events, social situtations and changes in routine, and becomes more able to adapt their behaviour in favourable conditions.

Literacy

- Talks about events and principal characters in stories and suggests how the story might end.

- Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues
- Use large-muscles movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks.
- Show preference for dominant hand
- Creates lines and circles pivoting from the shoulder and elbow.
- Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed for example putting coats on and doing up zips.

Communication and Language

- Joins in with repeated refrains and anticipates key events and phrases in rhymes and stories.
- Sing a large repertoire of songs
- Able to use language in recalling past experiences.
- Builds up vocabulary that reflects the breadth of their experiences
